Do you love to read? Do you like to talk with other readers about books you have enjoyed? If so, then this is the class for you. Each week we will read and discuss a novel about characters struggling to grow up in difficult circumstances. Discussions will center on the characters—why they act the way they do and how the author makes them come alive for us. Together we will also out act scenes from these novels, trace how the characters change in the course of the book, and write letters back and forth with the teacher about the novels. We will likely read *The Bronze Bow*, *Freak the Mighty*, and *The True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle*.

Topics will include motion, forces, pressure, energy, heat, sound, light, electricity, magnetism, and astrophysics. Emphasis will be placed on hands-on investigation and experimental analysis. We will use Macintosh iBooks or iMacs for data collection and computer simulations.
