

RUNNERS CROSS FINAL FINISH

The Varsity Cross Country squad finished their season as a team last Friday by placing 7th out of 14 teams in the #1 district in the state. Two individuals, Junior Standoff Gerry Glynn and Pete Talumbo, the top freshman runner in the area, advanced to this Saturday's regional meet at Sioux Passage. Rich Klosterman finished closely behind Talumbo, failing to qualify by a mere 3 places. Matt Harvey and Jim Jackson rounded out SLUH's top five at the meet. Glynn ran a 14:26 on the demanding Jefferson Barracks course, while Talumbo crossed the finish line in 14:38.

Glynn, the team's captain, has performed superbly all season and is sure to be one of the top runners in the area next year. Talumbo has also had an incredible season, and is the top freshman prospect on this side of the river. He has run and placed highly in all the Varsity meets, quite an accomplishment for a 14 year old against 17-18 year olds. Both he and Glynn can be counted on as good possibilities to place in the top 50 at Sioux Passage, thus enabling them to run in the State meet at Jeff City.

The entire Varsity team will return next year, with the exception of Jackson. They will most definitely have another winning season and they hope to qualify as a team for the State meet.
